- Please be aware of the following Scouts Canada policies regarding drug and alcohol use while on Camp Vanier property:

1010 Drug and Alcohol Policy, 17 November 2001, Revised: 25 March 2011 1010 (a) Drug Policy

 There shall be no recreational drug or substance consumed or made available on any Scout property – owned or leased.

#### 1010 (b) Alcohol Policy, 17 November 2001, Revised: 25 March 2011

- There shall be no alcohol at any Youth Program Activity, as defined in 1010(a).
- There shall be no alcohol where minors are present.
- Where permitted by and consistent with law, alcohol licenses may be sought for Scouts' sites and properties as required for adult events and 3<sub>rd</sub> party rentals.
- Scouts Canada encourages adults not to smoke when youth are present. Smoking is not allowed in any building (including outhouses). If members of your group smoke, please ensure cigarettes are disposed of responsibly to avoid litter and prevent any chance of starting a wildfire.
- User groups will be held responsible for any fire related damages / costs caused by smoking.
- Please be aware that all groups are responsible to completely remove all garbage, including cigarette butts from the Camp Vanier Site.
- Non-Scouting groups are required to follow the Camp Vanier General Rules.

#### SCOUTS CANADA, CAMP VANIER RENTAL AGREEMENT

This agreement is made between Scouts Canada, Northern Lights Council, hereinafter referred to as Scouts Canada and:

Group and Section or Organization

The agreement is for the rental of Camp Vanier with the following terms and conditions of the rental:

- A) <u>Booking/Damage Deposit:</u> Groups booking camp facilities must provide a damage/booking deposit of \$200.00 to be paid in full at time of booking to hold their booking date. This deposit is only refundable and transferable up to 7 days prior to arrival date and thereafter is 50% forfeited. The deposit is for buildings and tenting sites, overnights and day activities. After the building and / or site has been inspected, groups will have the deposit credited to their fees, applied to future camps or refunded.
- B) <u>Terms of Payment:</u> Groups will be invoiced for their camp rental and will have 30 days to settle the account. Groups not fully settling their accounts within 30 days will have their deposit applied to the account and their camp rental privileges then suspended until payment is received in full.
- C) <u>Camp Rules</u>: The group acknowledges that they have received, read, understand, and agrees to follow all the camp rules and regulations during their stay.
- D) <u>Cleaning:</u> All facilities used must be properly cleaned before departure. All sites must be left tidy and all garbage transported off site for appropriate disposal. Groups who leave their site or building in an unsatisfactory condition of cleanliness will forfeit their deposit.
- E) <u>Supervision:</u> Groups are responsible for the supervision of youth and adults attending camp and are responsible for their behavior and will be held liable for any damage(s) caused.
- F) <u>Arrival, Departure and Manifest of Individuals in Camp:</u> Groups will provide booking coordinator clear arrival and departure times as well as a manifest of who is on site at all times.
- G) <u>Emergency Communications</u>: The group acknowledges that there is no land line on the property, and it is the groups responsibility to bring more than one fully charged cell phone for the purpose of providing emergency services access (i.e. 9-1-1).
- H) Required Equipment and Check In / Out Procedures: The group acknowledges that they have reviewed the required equipment list and check in / out procedures for the areas of the camp being rented.
- Non-Scouting Groups: If the renter is a non-Scouting group, it is acknowledged that an insurance certificate listing Scouts Canada as an additional insured for \$2 million must be provided as well as signing and returning the attached organizational hold harmless agreement a minimum of 2 weeks prior to arrival.

Non-compliance may result in eviction and suspension of any future camp booking.

### CAMP REGULATIONS

The following are supplements to the Scouts Canada Bylaws, Policies and Procedures, and the Camping and Outdoor Activity Guide. Enjoy the camp; use it, but do not abuse it.

- All groups must bring a minimum of 2 fully charged cell phones for emergency use. There is no landline on the property.
- In the event of fire or medical emergency, call 9-1-1. Camp location and other emergency contact information are posted at the White Elephant and in all cabins.
- Leaders are responsible for the safety and conduct of their campers.
- First aid equipment is each group's responsibility. The nearest hospital (Cold Lake Health Centre) is 20 km away in Cold Lake North. Incidents must be reported to your Group Committee as soon as possible on the appropriate forms.
- The speed limit on the property is 20 kph.
- Quiet time is 11:00 PM.
- You are in bear country, be bear smart! Food and garbage should be stored in buildings or vehicles, never in tents.
- Firearms, pellet, paintball, airsoft guns, laser tag, slingshots or any other weapons are not permitted.
- Archery requires prior approval.
- Pets are not permitted. Service animals are welcome.
- Mattresses must stay on the beds. They are not to be used on the floors.
- Please do not enter other buildings or campsites without an invitation.
- Grey water is to be disposed of in appropriate pits, not in outhouses.
- Please do NOT dispose diapers and pull-ups in the outhouses.
- Any waterfront activities must have an adult leader present.
- No swimming alone, and no swimming or boating at night.
- PFD's or life jackets will be worn in boats and canoes at all times.
- White gas / propane powered lanterns and camp stoves are only permitted for use in the Rover Den,
   Venturer Cabin, or Leader Cabin, and only if adequate ventilation is provided.
- No white gas (naphtha / Coleman fuel) or other fuels may be stored in any buildings.
- Campfires:
  - Campfires are only permitted in the designated fire pits and must be attended at all times.
  - All fires must be fully extinguished (cold to touch) prior to departure.
  - Only dead, downed wood may be used in fire pits. Cut and stacked wood is for use in cabins.
  - Bushes and trees may not be cut without prior approval.
  - Any fire bans in place must be respected.
- ATV use:
  - ATV's may only be used for maintenance duties or providing transportation for individuals with mobility impairments.
  - Prior approval is required for all ATV use.
- Groups are responsible for cleaning up buildings & campsites prior to leaving camp.
- Groups are responsible to remove all trash from Camp Vanier on departure. Pack it in... pack it out!
- Groups using Camp Vanier facilities will be held financially responsible for any and all damages incurred during their visit.

- Drive 10km west on Highway 55 from the Highway 28 / 55 intersection.
- Turn north on to Range Road 432 at the Riverhurst intersection.
- Continue 6 km and watch for the sign indicating Camp Vanier and Camp Cooinda.
- Turn right onto this grid road and continue about 0.5km, Camp Vanier is at the end of this road.

### FROM EDMONTON (290km)

- Take Highway 28 east proceeding through Bonnyville.
- At Ardmore, turn north on Secondary Highway 892, then turn east on Highway 55 at the traffic roundabout towards Cold Lake.
- Turn north on Range Road 432 at the Riverhurst intersection.
- Continue 6 km and watch for the sign indicating Camp Vanier and Camp Cooinda.
- Turn right onto this grid road and continue about 0.5km, Camp Vanier is at the end of this road.

**GARBAGE DISPOSAL** 

- Currently, there are no waste disposal or recycling facilities available at Camp Vanier. Garbage disposal is the responsibility of user groups. Pack it in pack it out.
- Please ensure that diapers and pull-ups are disposed in the garbage and not thrown down the outhouses.
- Food scraps etc. are to be thrown out with the garbage, and not thrown in the bush.
- Fish entrails are to be thrown out with the garbage, and not disposed of in the lake or bush.
- Please remember you are in bear (and coyote, skunk, squirrel etc.) country. Please store garbage in a closed vehicle, or a secured can.
- Full garbage bags should not be stored in kitchen areas.

#### **Garbage Disposal:**

- The nearest waste transfer station is located at Hilda Lake:
  - Regular household waste disposal.
  - Hours of operation: Wed, Sat, Sun, 1000 1800hrs.
  - o Location: 64016 Range Road 434
    - When leaving Camp Vanier, turn right (West) on Township Rd 641
    - At the stop sign, cross Range Road 432A
    - At the stop sign, turn right (South) on Range Road 434.
    - Transfer station is located on your right just before the marked curve.
    - If asked, indicate you are with Camp Vanier at Ethel Lake.

#### Recycling:

- Recycling is available at:
  - Riverhurst Community Hall.
    - South side of Highway 55 at Range Road 432.
  - Cold Lake Recycling Centre
    - Location: 3609 50<sup>th</sup> St, Cold Lake
      - Located in Cold Lake South beside the Sears store.
    - Hours:
      - Mon to Fri, 0900 1700hrs, Sat 0900-1500 hrs for bottles, cans etc.
      - 24 hours a day for general recyclables including glass, metal, plastic, paper and cardboard.
